LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Governor Newsom took action on 1,206 bills this legislative session. He Signed 1,017 bills and vetoed 189 bills.

Bills Vetoed by the Governor

· SB 895 (Roth): Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Pilot Program

Would have authorized 10 community college districts to award Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degrees. Participating districts must have a nationally accredited Associate Degree in Nursing (AND) program.

· AB 2104 (Soria): Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Pilot Program

Would have authorized 10 community college districts to offer a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. The Chancellor would identify eligible community college districts based on specified criteria.

• AB 2277 (Wallis): Community colleges: part-time faculty

Would have increased the maximum amount of instructional hours that a part-time California Community College faculty member may teach at any one community college district.

Bills Signed by the Governor

· AB 2048 (Fong): Community colleges: sexual harassment: report

Requires the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges in consultation with stakeholders, to submit a report to the Legislature with recommendations for establishing systemic campus reforms that effectively prevent, detect, and address sexual harassment on community college campuses.

· SB 1244 (Newman): Dual Enrollment

This bill authorizes a community college district to enter a CCAP agreement with a K-12 LEA within the service area of another community college district if the community college district in the service area of the K-12 LEA has declined a request from the K-12 LEA or has failed to take action within 60 calendar days.

AB 2193 (Holden): Hazing

This bill creates civil liability for a public or private institution of higher education by a person harmed by a hazing incident that occurred on or after January 1, 2026, from an organization affiliated with the educational institution.
