The Applied Sciences Expo was held on April 24th with over 70 exhibitors and over 1200 students in attendance. Students learned about many different career options.

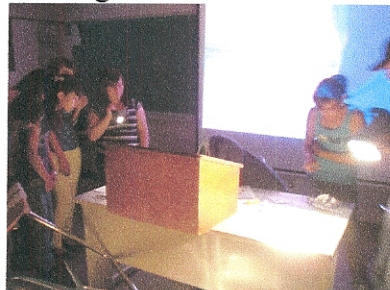
